Introduction

The NSW Department of Education congratulates you on being the winning team from your region in the Premier's Debating Challenge for Years 7 and 8. Over 350 teams entered the competition this year, and only the ten regional champions remain. They'll now face off in a state tournament at a residential camp to determine the 2024 champions.

In this package you will find details of organisation, information on the camp, the rules of the competition and forms for completion. Please contact the organisers at any time to discuss details of the championships (contact details below).

Each participating school is responsible for:

- Their team's travel arrangements. Some funds are available to assist regional areas with transport costs. Please contact the Speaking Competitions Officer about this assistance.
- Ensuring that the parent/caregiver of each team member completes the student permission form which makes up the final 2 pages of this package. These forms should be scanned and emailed to Tony Davey, the 2024 chief adjudicator, as soon as possible (contact details below).
- Completing risk assessments for travel to and from the championships.
- If applicable, preparing a parent/caregiver permission to cover permission to travel to and from the camp as per each team's arrangements.

The Arts Unit will provide:

- Three relief days for each team's teacher
- Part of the accommodation costs
- Fees and accommodation expenses for adjudicators
- Palm cards, pens and paper etc for use in all debates
- Completed risk assessments for the venue and accommodation

Camp fees

The cost for the camp is \$350.00 TBC (GST-free) per participating student. This covers accommodation, meals, trophies, and certificates. Each student should make this payment to their own school. The department will then charge each school after the championships using the intercompany journal process.

Relief for the accompanying teacher

Relief will be paid to each coordinator's school via the intercompany journal process. Please let the office at your school know to look out for a payment of \$1,599 TBC (GST-free, includes oncosts) with the description 'Debating relief x 3 days 4 to 6 Dec 24.'

Camp organisation

Registration

Please fill out the 'Team registration form' included in this package and email it to The Arts Unit as soon as possible so that we can begin work on room allocation. Ensure that all names are correctly spelt and printed, as this form will be used to print the certificates which will be presented at the end of the championships. Please send the form as soon as you have the names of your team, and then resend as soon as you have the necessary dietary and health information.

Student accommodation

Students will be allocated to either single or twin rooms. Every effort will be made to ensure that team members are able to room with each other, but male and female students will be accommodated in nearby but separate parts of the college. Separate bathrooms will be allocated to students.

Teacher accommodation

Teachers will be accommodated in rooms at the end of the student sections. Separate bathrooms will be allocated to teachers.

Recreation time

Recreation time will be supervised by the regional coordinators. The organisers will brief the teams before the tournament as to recreational options for the camp.

Travel

Teams are responsible for their own travel to the championships. The Women's College is located within the grounds of the university, with an entrance on Carillon Ave, Newtown. Parking will be available at the college.

Meals

All meals will be taken together in the dining room. The first meal will be morning tea on Wednesday, and the last will be morning tea on Friday. Each day will include a morning and afternoon tea and a supper along with regular meals. If any member of your team or any adult has special dietary requirements, please contact The Arts Unit as soon as you're aware and then include that information on the registration form.

Health requirements

Please notify The Arts Unit immediately if any member of your team has special health needs like severe allergies that will need to be managed. Note that a risk assessment for the camp will be sent to each participating school.

2024 Years 7 and 8 state final

Don't forget that parents, families and friends are welcome to come to the state final on Fridday at 10.00am. The final will be recorded for use as a teaching aid in schools, and a video of the final will also be posted online for the public to view and download.



Rules of the championships

- This competition is for the 10 regional champion teams from NSW government schools in the Premier's Debating Challenge for Years 7 and 8.
- In each debate there will be only 4 members per team of which only 3 will speak. Only the 4 participating members will be allowed into preparation.
- All teams are required to be present at the designated meeting place 10 minutes prior to scheduled preparation time.
- Debating teams are to be attired in school uniform.
- For every debate there will be a choice of 3 topics. Topics will be set by the chief adjudicator in consultation with the adjudicators. All teams will choose from the same list of 3 topics in each round.
- During topics selection, only the 4 team members involved in the debate will be involved in the ranking of the topics from 1 to 3.
- Both 3rd choices will be eliminated, and the highest-rated topic chosen.
 Where two remaining topics are equally popular, a coin toss shall decide between them.
- The toss of a coin will determine affirmative/negative. The winner of the toss is the affirmative.
- For each round there will be a period of 60 minutes for preparation. There will be no adult present in the room during this time.
- The only materials allowed in preparation will be a timer, blank palm cards, paper and pens.
- Dictionaries will not be provided for preparation, and will not be allowed in the preparation rooms.
- Students may not take bags, mobile phones, or preparation aids into preparation.
- Teams will prepare in the same preparation room on any given day.
- Each team's teacher will supervise the opposition team during preparation. They are responsible for ensuring the team remains undisturbed and for escorting the team to the debate once the 60 minutes has passed.
- Each speaker has 6 minutes to speak. There will be a warning bell at 4 minutes with two bells at 6 minutes. There will be a continuous bell if a speaker exceeds the speaking time by more than 1 minute.
- Each team will debate 5 times in the round-robin section.
- An adjudicator appointed by The Arts Unit will adjudicate all debates. Their decision will be final.
- The teams will be placed into two pools of 5, and will debate the other 4 teams in their pool plus one team from the other pool. The two highest-ranked teams from each pool will proceed to the semi-finals, where the winner from one pool will face the runner-up from the other pool.
- In the event that teams draw for semi-final spots, tiebreakers will be applied in the following order: head-to-head, strength of win, strength of schedule, adjudicator ranking. If more than two teams are drawn, the tiebreakers are applied in order until one team is eliminated and the process is restarted.
- The winners of the semi-finals will proceed to the state final on Friday. All teams are expected to attend the state final.
