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Timm O'Regan - Building a Body of Work

This talk centres around senior visual arts students and strategies that can be used in the creation of their year 12 B.O.W. Student examples will be shown, discussed and explanations given as to why the works have achieved high A and why they were chosen to be included into ARTEXPRESS exhibitions. Timm has taught Visual arts for 38 years, been a HSC marker for 10 years and Head Teacher CAPA for 30 years, with many of his student's works featuring in ARTEXPRESS. Timm is also a practicing artist with numerous exhibitions to his credit. Ceramics and painting are his major practice areas.

Carol McGilvery - The written examination using Visual Arts content

Since 2021 Carol McGilvery has been part of the HSC Strategy - Statewide Leadership Team, providing high quality Professional Learning to teachers across NSW. This presentation is designed to show students how to connect different elements of the syllabus content, so students are well prepared for the written examination, and can demonstrate the extent of their knowledge and understanding of the Visual Arts in the examination.

Carol McGilvery - Study Skills

Using knowledge from best practice, this Study Skills presentation will empower students to know how to learn course content relevant to the way they learn best. This will motivate and prepare students for upcoming examinations.

Sharon McEachern - ARTEXPRESS and Artist Influence on Making

Sharon McEachern is the Deputy Principal at Albury High School. She is also a practicing artist and a successful HSC Visual Arts teacher with over 25 years of experience. This session will look at selected ARTEXPRESS artworks and the importance of influencing artists on the creation of your BOW, with reference to Visual Arts content areas.

Bronwen Garner - Hyphen Gallery Presentation

Hyphen is dedicated to the presentation of experiences that nurture creativity, connection and curiosity in an accessible and inspiring environment. Our name – Hyphen – connects the building's twin purposes of art and literature and reflects its amazing architecture and dash-like shape – the signature cantilever over the building's main entrance. Hyphen features several galleries – Artspace Gallery, Playspace Gallery and Community Gallery – as well as a full library service. It also features three meeting rooms; the Community Studio overlooking the courtyard suitable for workshops, meetings and presentations; Creative Studio for resident artists; Tech Studio and Sound Studio; and a Sculpture Terrace.

Leona Beeson - S&S Wholesale

Leona is the National Sales Manager and has been with the company since 1983. S&S offer a variety of teacher workshops on Ceramics, Screen Printing and Printmaking, which are held at metro and regional high schools. Our representatives also conduct senior workshops for students focusing on products and processes for Bodies of Work. In Albury, Leona will be demonstrating the range of drawing products and encourage students and teachers to try them and to experiment with products they may not have used previously. All students and teachers will take home their artworks and a sample. Teachers will take home a promotional sample bag.
